This year marks the 22nd annual 20 Under 40 Leadership Awards Recognition Program. The 2017 program brings the number of distinguished 20 Under 40 award recipients to 440. The 20 Under 40 program focuses on individuals who are making exceptional contributions to the community and/or have distinguished themselves in their careers. It is intended that the program will assist in motivating young leaders in the area. The awards program also represents a networking opportunity for candidates and attendees. Chrys Peterson, a former news anchor for WTOL-TV11 who is a communications consultant and continues to be a significant community advocate is the master of ceremonies for the awards event.

The list of past and present 20 Under 40 award recipients is a virtual who's who of current and future community leaders. To become an award recipient, many candidates have been nominated two to three or more times in as many years. Nominations for the 20 Under 40 awards come from all segments of the community.






